Phillips in Association with Bacs & Russo Announces Further Highlights from The Geneva Watch Auction: XII

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Retrospective: 2000 - 2020, a Themed Auction Curated by Phillips x Blackbird

The Three-Day Live Auction Series Runs from 6 to 8 November, Presenting Outstanding Timepieces Including an Extremely Rare Patek Philippe Reference 2499 Second Series in Yellow Gold

GENEVA – 1 OCTOBER 2020 – Phillips in Association with Bacs & Russo reveals additional highlights from [The Geneva Watch Auction: XII](#), further to the recent announcement of the extraordinary [Patek Philippe reference 2523/1](#) world time in pink gold with guilloché dial, the top lot of the upcoming November sale. Taking place at Hôtel La Réserve, Geneva on November 6-7, the double evening sale will be followed by [Retrospective: 2000 - 2020](#), a themed auction curated by Phillips x Blackbird to be held on November 8, 2020.

Phillips has curated a dynamic selection of watches spanning the 20th and 21st centuries, demonstrating the savoir-faire, technical and design prowess of the watch industry. These watches are united in their rarity, state of preservation and relevance, and will attract the budding enthusiast and seasoned collector alike. The selection is led by a series of pieces from a tightly curated private collection and hail from power houses such as Patek Philippe and Rolex.

Aurel Bacs, Senior Consultant of Bacs & Russo and **Alex Ghotbi, Head of Watches Continental Europe & Middle East** jointly commented: "Our selection of watches in The Geneva Watch Auction: XII is a tribute to 20th and 21st century horology. The wide selection covers all periods, styles and prices with two common denominators: the quality of the watches and our passion for them. We are also delighted to have watches from two of the world's leading collectors, one who has consigned close to 30 astounding pieces and that we have dubbed "Mr. Green" and another, a Patek Philippe reference 2499 2nd Series from the private collection of renowned scholar John Goldberger."

Highlights from The Geneva Watch Auction: XII, November 6 & 7

A Private Collection

The sale presents a group of close to 30 timepieces from the private collection of one of the world's greatest collectors and scholars, with an astute eye for detail and uncompromising desire for quality. Included in this collection is an eclectic choice of Patek Philippe, Omega, Longines and Rolex watches, among others. The star lot of this collection is an incredibly well-preserved and most probably unpolished Rolex reference 8171 in stainless steel (estimate CHF 300,000-600,000).

Patek Philippe

The fresh to market timepieces from Patek Philippe cover a wide range of complications, styles and periods. From a superb reference 130 in steel with sector dial from 1939 originally sold in France and being offered by a French family (estimate CHF 250,000-450,000), to an extremely rare reference 3974 minute repeater with perpetual calendar in platinum from 2001 with an opaline dial as well as a black dial with Breguet numerals (estimate CHF 700,000-1,400,000).

Going back in time to vintage Patek Philippe complications, Phillips has the pleasure of offering a very well preserved reference 1518 in yellow gold from the 1940s, coming from an important private collection this reference was launched in 1941 and was the world's first perpetual calendar chronograph made in series (estimate CHF 250,000-450,000). The successor to the reference 1518 was the reference 2499, launched in 1951 it features a larger 37.5mm case and more "sporty" pump pushers.

Phillips is also proud to offer two reference 2499's in the sale. The first: a second series from the collection of one of the greatest collectors and scholars: John Goldberger (estimate CHF 700,000-1,200,000), the second: a third

series retailed by famed Swiss retailer Bayer and one of only four known with the Bayer signature. The watch is in an incredible state of preservation and comes with its original box, certificate and even invoice (estimate CHF 400,000-800,000).

Rolex

The selection of Rolex models will include specimens rarely seen on the market. An incredibly well-preserved reference 6200 "Big Crown", one of Rolex's first Submariner models. An iconic piece with the sought after 3, 6, 9 "Explorer dial", this example comes with an incredible chocolate "tropical dial" (estimate CHF 400,000-800,000). The desire for gold Daytonas with Paul Newman dials is as strong as ever and Phillips has the pleasure of offering a very well-preserved reference 6241 "John Player Special" in 14k yellow gold (estimate CHF 600,000-1,200,000).

Highlights from Retrospective: 2000 - 2020, November 8

Organised with Blackbird, Retrospective: 2000 - 2020 showcases the first twenty years of this millennium and presents some of the most relevant and important watches made in the past two decades.

Patek Philippe

To be offered for the first time at auction is a possibly unique pink gold reference 5531 world time minute repeater with cloisonné enamel dial representing the Geneva lake, with a gold bracelet (estimate CHF 500,000-1,000,000). Further highlights include a superb reference 5207 perpetual calendar, minute repeater tourbillon in platinum (estimate CHF 350,000-700,000), and appearing on the market for the first time an incredibly rare reference 5959 split seconds chronograph in pink gold with black dial (estimate CHF 180,000-360,000).

F.P. Journe

François-Paul Journe's superb creations have been garnering increasing attention from the collecting community. The six timepieces presented in this sale will include his incredible Grande et Petite Sonnerie in steel (estimate CHF 300,000 - 600,000), a Tourbillon Souverain "Black Label" that was available only to existing owners of F.P. Journe watches (estimate CHF 80,000-160,000), and his signature Resonance in 38mm platinum case with brass movement (estimate CHF 50,000-100,000).

Zenith

Zenith has once again trusted Phillips with the sale of a one-off creation, the *Lupin The Third* chronograph, directly reproducing the dial of a Zenith worn in the celebrated Japanese manga. Proceeds from the sale will benefit the charity Zoé4Life, a registered non-profit organisation, recognised as a public service utility whose mission is to support research, provide financial support to families in need, support kids during their treatments and raise awareness about childhood cancer.

Further Highlights

Retrospective: 2000 - 2020 will offer timepieces from some of the newer brands who were created in the 21st century and have since gained a cult following. Highlights include Richard Mille and the impressive RM038 "Bubba Watson" tourbillon in a magnesium case (estimate CHF 180,000-360,000), and a unique Kari Voutilainen dual time decimal minute repeater (estimate CHF 135,000-225,000).

Additional important watches to be offered from prestigious brands such as Patek Philippe, Rolex, A. Lange & Söhne, Audemars Piguet, Breguet, MB&F, Greubel Forsey, Urwerk, De Bethune, Laurent Ferrier or Cartier, to name a few.
