
Post-War and Contemporary Masters Lead Phillips' April Editions Auction

Auction Realizes \$5.4 Million, Led by Andy Warhol, Roy Lichtenstein, and Jean-Michel Basquiat with Records Achieved for Richard Serra, Niki de Saint Phalle, and Joan Miró

Cary Leibowitz and Kelly Troester, Worldwide Co-Heads of Editions and Deputy Chairpersons, Americas, said, "Our April marquee auction brought together a robust group of works for collectors of all interests, starting with 72 works from the Lower East Side Printshop's archives and continuing through two days of exceptional prints and multiples. With bidders participating from nearly 45 countries, it's clear that the demand for high quality prints and multiples by the most important artists of the past century remains as strong as ever. We saw prices soar across the board, as Warhol's single neon pink *Moonwalk* realized \$463,550 against its estimate of \$120,000-180,000, while Basquiat's set *Untitled (from Leonardo)* tripled its estimate at \$177,800, and Dan Flavin's (to Don Judd, colorist) 1-7 saw its auction debut as a complete set selling for over three times above its low estimate. There was enthusiastic worldwide bidding across the phone banks and online for the 22 Warhol drawings on offer with 72% of them selling

above their high estimates. Across the sessions, Jeffrey Gibson, Pablo Picasso, Derrick Adams, Jasper Johns, Marcel Duchamp, Sonia Delaunay, Jean Dubuffet, and Philip Guston sparked competitive bidding – matching the appetite we've seen for editions in the market. We look forward to Editions auctions throughout the month of June in London, Hong Kong, and New York.
