Prior to joining Bonhams, he spent more than 30 years at Christie's in London, where he was involved with the sale of many notable individual works including *Man with Red Hair* by Francis Bacon, and in achieving new world records for paintings by L S Lowry, David Bomberg and Sir Stanley Spencer.

Ms. Yang joins Phillips from Christie's New York, where she was an Associate Vice President, Specialist in Post-War & Contemporary Art, and head of the Afternoon Sale. Ms. Yang works closely with a number of top Asian-based private collectors and museums. While based in New York, she will continue to work in that regard, as well as with Phillips' rapidly expanding contemporary art team in Asia.

Ms. Garcia joins Phillips from The Elkon Gallery, where she held the positions of Gallery Manager and Director in New York since 2004, and most recently served as Gallery Liaison based in Miami. She previously worked for Neuhoff Gallery and in Sotheby's Latin American Art Department.
